Is there something the deceased would like the family members to be read or told at the service? Prepare this and store it in a known place or give to the funeral home during preplanning.
Prepare the obituary for the newspaper and to be read at the service
Prepare in writing any particular memories or stories the family has they would like to share (give to the officiant).
Are there special photos to include at the service, to put on a board or make into a video presentation that will play before or during the service?
Will a meal be provided for the family and out-of-town guests? If so, make necessary arrangements.
